

Message from Reverend Chris Peck – Rector for The Uplands Group of Churches

The Turning Year

The year has just turned as I write this; we have entered a new year and a new decade. By the time you read this, the days will be beginning to lengthen and little signs of the oncoming Spring will be appearing. The changes in the seasons remind us that change is central to all life and cannot be avoided.

There will be many changes in the Uplands over the coming months. I will retire as Rector of the Uplands in March. My final service will be Sunday 8th March at 10.00 at Guilsborough and it would be lovely to share that service with as many who would like to be there. The following week Judy and I will be moving to Little Brington.

Rev'd Allison Twigg will become Acting Rector and I hope in due course will be installed as Rector of the Uplands Group. As we are not moving far away, Judy will continue to serve as Assistant Priest in the Uplands, at least until a new appointment is made. There will be changes in the way the Uplands Group is structured and changes in the pattern of worship. What will not change is the constant love of God for each resident of the eight villages and two hamlets that make up the Uplands: the love that brought God to earth in the person of Jesus Christ that we celebrated at Christmas; the love that took Jesus to the Cross which we remember on Good Friday; the love that burst through the barrier of death on Easter day, having taken on itself all the evil and sin in the world, and brought into being that Kingdom of peace and goodwill that the angels proclaimed; and, the love that pours upon us the gracious fire of the Holy Spirit that we celebrate at Pentecost.

It is my experience of that love of God which has sustained me through all the challenges and joys of ministry in the Uplands. It is that love that I have sought to share with others and that I have longed to see expressed in our relationships with one another. It is that love that will sustain the Uplands into God's future; and it is to that love of God that I commend you as we move into our different futures.

Update on the introduction of Toilet and Served facilities at St Denys Church Ravensthorpe

The external works to the North path are now complete with the exception of the areas which will need to be turfed/re-seeded when the weather improves. The internal works are progressing and the toilet and served are nearing completion with both currently undergoing final finishing. The last piece of work is the replacement of the wooden plinth in the south aisle which will be replaced with a stone floor. A further grant has been received from the All Churches Trust for £ 3,000. The South path steps have now also been repaired with new stone risers. If you are taking machinery or any equipment into the church yard which is likely to damage the South path, please use the churchyard entrance by the allotments instead.

Parish Electoral Role – St Denys Church Ravensthorpe

This is the basic list in the parish of all those entitled to vote on elections within the *Church of England, this includes the Annual Parochial Church Meeting (APCM)*. Those entitled to have their names on this roll have to be 16 years of age or more and they must reside in the parish or be regular worshippers in church whose roll they wish to join. The roll is completely renewed every six years, at which point all members have to re-apply for membership or else their names will be deleted. Fiona Maye (Emma Thompson) is an eminent judge in the Family Division of the High Court, making daily decisions about complex family issues. But her workload is heavy and her marriage to American professor Jack (Stanley Tucci) is at breaking point.



In this moment of personal crisis, Fiona is asked to rule in the case of Adam (Fiona Whitehead), a brilliant and beautiful teenager who is refusing on religious grounds the blood transfusion which will save his life.

Wanting to hear from Adam before making a decision, Fiona goes to his hospital bedside. This extraordinary meeting releases strong emotions, with momentous consequences for both of them as Fiona decides whether Adam should live or die.

Honeyland

Nestled in an isolated mountain region deep within the Balkans, kindly Hatidze Muratova lives with her ailing mother in a deserted village without roads, electricity or running water. She's the last in a long line of Macedonian wild beekeepers using traditional methods to eke out a living farming honey in small batches.

When an unruly itinerant family moves in what at first seems like a balm for her solitude becomes a source of tension as they too want to practice bee keeping while disregarding her advice. This causes a breach in the natural order that provokes a conflict with Hatidze that exposes the fundamental tension between nature and humanity, harmony and discord, exploitation and sustainability.
